

**KANSAS CLUB CALF ASSOCIATION  
SHOW CONTRACT  
2008**

Thank You for having a KCCA sanction show. Throughout the year, KCCA members accumulate points at sanctioned shows and receive awards at the end of the year. If your organization is concerned about local exhibitors losing to the out of county members, we encourage you to offer a 'COUNTY ONLY' class with prizes that are not offered to the other exhibitors. The benefit your county exhibitors will receive from watching other more experienced showmen exhibit their animals will far out weigh the price of the extra prizes and it will improve the quality of animals exhibited at your county fair.

We will encourage members throughout the state to pre-enter and attend your show. We do require you to accept late entries since many of these exhibitors will simply decide the morning of the show to attend. WE would strongly suggest that you charge at least double for those exhibitors who do not pre-enter. This will encourage more exhibitors to pre-enter. On your show bill give the date entries are due and list the amount due for those entries received after that date (cash only should be accepted late.)

1. Organizations or individuals planning to sponsor or stage a Club Calf Show and wishing it to be sanctioned by the KCCA, must obtain the prior approval of the KCCA if the results of such event are to be entered into the KCCA's records and points awarded to the exhibitors. Approval does not carry over from year to year, but must be obtained for each individual show or event.
2. Breed Association Steer and heifer Shows may be approved by the KCCA, provided these events are open to all 4-H, FFA and other youth that show cattle within the State of Kansas . Points earned at these events will be allowed to count towards the breed division standings, but not towards the All-Around standings. The KCCA reserves the right to approve one show per calendar year conducted by the same organization or management.
3. For a show to be approved and points awarded, beginning with the next fiscal year, A Steer or Heifer show will be required to use the official KCCA breed format, unless prior approval is obtained from the KCCA secretary.
4. The entire show results must be turned into the KCCA within 10 days of the show. This is very important to the continuing support of the show for the exhibitors and the KCCA.
5. The KCCA reserves the right to set up a KCCA booth at all sanctioned shows at no expenses to the KCCA or its members. This booth shall be used to sell KCCA merchandise, enroll members and to distribute literature and publications.
6. Premium money must be paid to the exhibitors no later than 14 days after completion of the show.
7. When promoting or advertising a KCCA sanctioned show, the show sponsors or officials must publicize prior to the event if breeds will be mixed or the official KCCA breed format will be used; and how much of the entry fee will be paid back to the exhibitors by publicizing a percentage, a break-down of the entry fees, or any similar means.
8. Sanctioning fees are to be determined from year to year and will be published at the beginning of each fiscal year. For 2008 this fee is \$125.00.
9. The KCCA requires that show managers require all exhibitors to show their own animals in the ring. The only exception being, if the member is injured and unable physically to lead the animal in the ring, but is in attendance of the particular event, or if the exhibitor has 2 or more animals in the same class.  
The KCCA will not be responsible for the formulation of or enforcement of individual show rules. These are the sole responsibility of the show management.

Although the individual show has the right to run their show as they see fit, the KCCA does have 2 requirements which must be adhered to They are:

1. All breeds of steers and heifers must be allowed to show. If your show requires a certain number of one breed to be exhibited to offer a class, then you must offer AOB or X-Bred class to put those steer or heifers in which do not have the numbers to support a breed class.
2. The sanctioned show will need to have information available for all members to fill out at the time of check in. This information must be clear steer tag numbers (4-H tags, or Tattoo numbers. The show management will compile the results and return them; along with a full breakdown of class placing's in all classes to the KCC Secretary within 10 days of the show. And NO LATER than 30 days after the show, OR AN ADDITIONAL FEE OF \$25.00 WILL BE DUE. These breakdowns will need to include the Champion in each breed of steers and heifers as the exhibitors receive points for having the Breed Champion. Also this information needs to show each class winner and the placing's of each class. The punctuality of this is very important. We try to keep the point standing up to date. Without your placing's and complete information we can not do this.

BELOW IS A LIST OF THE BREED LASSES APPROVED FOR THE SHOW SEASON 2006 FOR KCCA:

STEERS: Angus, Red Angus, Brangus, Charolais, Chianina, Gelbvieh, Hereford , Limousin , Maine Anjou , Appendix Shorthorn, Shorthorn, Simmental, and X-Bred.

HEIFERS: Angus, Red Angus, Brangus, Charolais, Chianina, Gelbvieh, Hereford , Limousin , Maine Anjou , Appendix Shorthorn. Shorthorn, Simmental, AOB for Maintainer's and Commercial.

All shows must offer a class for these animals which do not fall in the breed listed in the above category. On your entry blank have the entrant list the breed of their animal. If they are listed as a Maine , they must show in the Maine class. If you do not have enough Maine animals to warrant having a class, they should be put into the AOB or X-Bred division. Do not let the exhibitor tell you which class they want to be in, they will choose whichever class benefits them the most. WE are trying to keep the point system as even as possible. There is always someone who will take advantage of any situation; so if you can stay fairly close to the guidelines listed above it will keep our point system more consistent.

We have been informed some parents have called and asked for a complete list of all the placing's in the show. It is your decision whether to send these lists to the exhibitor's parents or not, but we would strongly suggest that you

Ask for \$20.00 advance payment for this service.

Once again thank you for sanctioning your show. The fee is \$125.00 if you have any question's, please feel free to give us a call at any time.

MEMBERS MUST ATTEND AT LEAST 4 SHOWS TO CLAIM PRIZES AT THE END OF THE YEAR. This new rule should help your attendance. Thanks so much for your support.
